My cancer timeline



- Prior to 2010 (aged 40) no health issues
- 2010 leiomyosarcoma left ankle
 - From GP to resection at Birmingham Royal Orthopaedic 5wks (private/NHS)
- 2012 basal cell carcinoma
- 2014 our son, Oscar, died of medulloblastoma
- 2017 retroperitoneal leiomyosarcoma
 - From diagnosis to treatment (4wks) at Leeds Regional Sarcoma Centre
 - Three chemotherapy cycles (Leeds NHS) and resection at Royal Marsden (private)
- 2018 Li-Fraumeni Syndrome (LFS) diagnosis via Prof Ros Eeles (Royal Marsden)
 - Current observation protocol via Prof Gareth Evans (Christie)
 - In 2018 we confirmed Oscar had mutated TP53

What is sarcoma?



- Sarcoma is a type of cancer.
- 15 people a day will receive a diagnosis of sarcoma cancer in the UK.
- They can develop anywhere in the body, including the muscle, bone, tendons, blood vessels and fatty tissues.
- There are around 100 sub-types of sarcoma.
- Sarcoma UK is a national charity that funds research, offers support and campaigns for better treatments.



Raising Awareness

- Early diagnosis is important.
- Sarcoma is more common than we thought.
- Awareness is needed on both the patient and medical side.





Funding Research

- Sarcoma UK is now one of the biggest funders of sarcoma research in the UK, having invested more than £2 million to date and funded 44 projects.
- We're investing £750K this year into training research leaders of the future, genomic research and research that will improve treatment and care for patients.
- Launched Genomic Research Grant of £250,000 using SUK allocated samples from 100,000 Genomic Project
- Research is high quality and assessed by academic peer review.

Our Information

- Information we provide is patient focussed, driven by patient need and reviewed by them
- 13,000 sarcoma information booklets/factsheets downloaded in 2017-18
- Eight in 10 people tell us we've answered their questions about sarcoma.*
